Original Attestations

Instructions regarding the despatch of Documents on the transfer of soldiers to the Reserve.

1. When a soldier is transferred to the Reserve the documents named in the margin, arranged in the same sequence, will be placed inside this form, and sent by the Officer who carries out the transfer to the Officer charged with the custody of the documents of Army Reserve men of the Corps to which he belongs.

2. Should any of the man's documents be missing, an explanation of the deficiency, signed by the Commanding Officer, must be substituted for the missing documents.

3. A Form of "Receipt for documents" (Army Form B. 279) will be sent with the transfer documents.

4. The Officer to whom the documents are sent should check them as soon as possible; if they are found to be correct, he should sign and return Army Form B. 279. Should any document be missing, he must at once apply for it.

5. When soldiers are sent home from abroad for transfer to the Army Reserve, the documents specified in the margin will be placed inside this form, and sent home with the men, for transmission to the Officer by whom their transfer to the Army Reserve is to be carried out, together with the following additional documents, viz. :—

(a) New Company Conduct Sheet (Army Form B 121) completed in accordance with the instructions in the King's Regulations.

(b) Parchment certificate (Army Form D. 426.)

When a man serving in the Cavalry and Infantry of the Line is transferred to the Reserve at Home, the Officer charged with the custody of the Army Reserve documents will, on receipt of the man's transfer documents from the Officer who carries out the transfer, be responsible that the original attestation is also obtained, and preserved with the other transfer documents.

The original attestations of Reservists of other arms of the service will remain in the custody of the Officer in charge of the original attestations of the corps from which they were transferred to the Army Reserve. (See King's Regulations.)
