 one should insert each of them in the order of their rank in the column of Occupation.
 COMMERCIAL TRAVELLERS, CLERKS, COMMERCIAL AGENTS, MANAGERS, and other persons who are employed in the management of any business, should be entered in the column of Occupation, and not in the column of Trade, Manufacture, or Profession.
 TRADES, MANUFACTURES, and Professions, should be entered in the column of Occupation, and not in the column of Trade, Manufacture, or Profession.
 No persons absent on the night of Sunday, March 31st, to be entered here: EXCEPT those (not enumerated elsewhere) who may be out at Work or Travelling, &c., during that Night, and who RETURN HOME ON MONDAY, APRIL 1st.
 Subject to the above instruction, the Name of the Head of the Family should be written first; then the names of his Wife, Children, and other Relatives; then those of Visitors, Boarders, Servants, &c.
