15 MAY 1917

I, *Thos. Lennox* of *Bridge St. Castledawson*, hereby  
certify that *Pte R. Irwin, 1st Batt. R. Irish Fusiliers*,  
made the following statement to me on *7th Sept. 1915*:  
"Uncle, I may be killed & if so I want you to know  
that I have between *£8 & 9* to my credit in Army  
accounts. I want you to see that my mother gets  
this & anything else belonging to me, should I fall"
