He was buried mext day in company with many others I was not an eye

witness to the buriel.

No.65 Pto G. Forrest, 54th Battelion was my Runner or the morning of the 7th June 1917, during an our attack on Grey's Farm he was with me until a few minuted after leaving our transhes. I did not see him again. There was heavy shelling and in my opinion he was killed by chell fire. He was missed by me before I had reached the front line of German trenches.

I saw him hit by a sniper in the right hip, the bullet went into his body, he was not two yards from me when hit. It was in front lines at Pasendaele Ypres. He was suffering great pain and had to wait in a shell hole for about 5 hours before we could get stretcher bearers. I helped carry him to the Field Dressing Station, we thought he would die on the way. I did not know much about him as he was in B.Coy. but he told me his home was at Lithgow.
