He was a H. Quarters bomber the same as myself, we were together in the front lines during the advance at Pely on Wood. I was wounded shortly after, when in hospital I heard that Hart was missing, so I wrote a mate of mine Pte Grundy, in H. Q. bombers, and he stated that he found Hart's Body and buried him. I knew him well, he came from Victoria, and worked on a farm there. He was a native of Ireland, and spoke very good. He was known as Paddy in the Batt.

I knew Pate Hart and McCracken. We were in action together at Polygon Wood. Things were getting warm and they took cover in a shell hole. I can swear that a shell dropped and blew the shell hole to smithereens.

"I knew Casualty. He was a tall man, about 5 ft. 11 ins. slightly built, dark complexion, about 28 years of age, known as "James". Casualty was in a shell hole at Polygon Wood on the 16th September, 1918. An H.K. shell exploded in the shell hole killing him instantly and Pte. H. T. Pace and J. M. McCracken. I was in another shell hole alongside and I saw Casualty's body immediately afterwards. He was most severely wounded all over. I do not know if Casualty was ever buried."

I knew Casualty, he was dark, well built, 5'8" in height, about 30 years of age, known as "Paddy".  
Casualty with me and two others, Pte. Pace, and Pte. McCracken, when the enemy put over a very heavy barrage, which buried me, and killed Casualty, and Pte. Pace,. I do not know what happened to their bodies.

I was not an eye-witness, but was speaking to above about 5 o'clock on the night of the 28th., when later the Germans put over a barrage, and Hart was not seen again. This happened in Glencourse Wood, he was of medium build, dark was an Irishman, good natured, and about 5'8" in height.

"I received a letter from Pte W. Gundry, H.Q. Bomber at the end of October, telling me that he had found Pte Hart lying dead, side by side with Pte Pace, just over the parapet near Polygon Wood. Hart was a H.Q. Bomber."
