

Honwas a Sgt. in A. Coy. His brother in D.Coy. came over with me. His brother's name is Joseph. They came from Gunnedah, N.S.W. but were born in Engpend. Sgt. Dwyer of No. 11, A.Coy. told me that the Sgt. walked cut of a dugout without a helmet and a piece of shrapnel hit bin on the head and killed him on the spot. This was last January. I was talking to his brother about it a little time ago. We were at Pontenipe(1) at the time.

He was in A. Co., I believe III Pltn. I had known Sergt. Richmond for 9 or 10 menths, and was in the habit of seeing him every day. He was about 5ft. 7" in height, well built. Its brown hair and had freekled face. He had relations in Ireland. He was killed in Hoop lines sector, about half an hours walk from Armentieros about the 29th January.1917. I thank did not see him killed or buried, but I was told by Pt. F Abrams of A. Co., 3rd. Pltn., 34th A.I.F. (2nd reinforcement) that he had seen Richmond's grave in the Military Cometery at Armentieros. Abrams did not sey if there was a cross and name on it. Abrams is amployed in the Battalian W.M. Stores at the present time attending to the graves.

He was buried in the principal centery in Armentieres. I have seen his grave. The cenetary is on the left side of the road from Telloux to Armentieres, on the Armentieres side of the Ganal. Our Divl. Headquarters were quite near it."

one night about end of Jamiary we were putting a barrage over to our right to prepare a raid by another batth, and Fritz was replying heavily on us. Richmond was in the communication trench between the front line and supports. He was hit in the neck and said 'Oh! I'm hit' and died instantly. I saw his body within an hour of his death and looked at the wound. The other dotails I had at the time from a Sgt. who was present when he was hit but I forget his mance. I have seen his grave in Armentieres military cemetery. It has a cross over it with his name on. I were his steel helpet for nonths after. He was an all round sport and was always there when anything was doing. He was extremely popular with the men. (Informant knew his exact number.)

He belonged to A.Coy. and I saw him just after he had been killed about January 20th in Houpline sector Armentieres. He was killed by a shell which cut his wind pipe and I saw 9/Rs. bandaging him up but it was no good. He is buried at the military femetery Armentieres where I have seen his grave with a cross with his name and rank on. I know him well. We joined at same time, October 1915. He died within a few minutes of being wounded.

*Sgt Richmond was killed in the trenches by shell fire at Armentieres and is buried in the Cite Bon Jean Cemetery. A cross marks the grave there is a rood headstone easily recognisable and the grave is well cared for. I enlisted him myself at Gunadah in New South Wales and I was Officer of the watch at the time he was Filled.

"I did not actually see Sgt Richmond killed, but I saw his body after his death. He was killed instantaneously by a shrapnel bullet through the head. I am sure he is the same man you are enquiring about. We called him "Bully" Richmond (Bully was short for William). He was buried in a cemetery near Armentieres called Cits bon Jean. I think that J.P. Grant, 1828 of our Battn (34 A.I.F.) whom they are also enquiring about was buried at the same place."
